



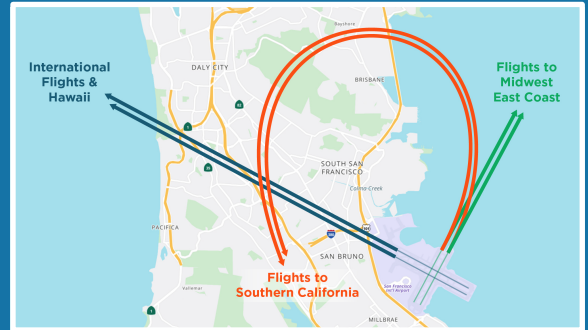

Notice Regarding Runway Closures at SFO

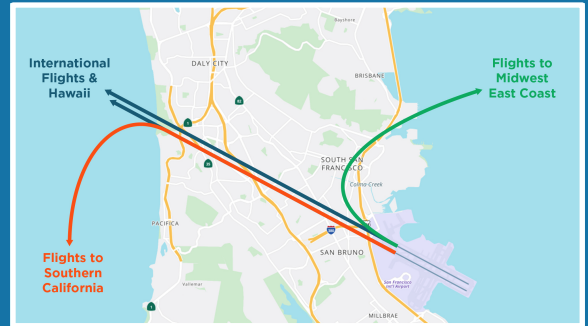
Closure of two runways will temporarily change flight patterns overhead

SFO is planning to close two runways this year to repave and make adjacent taxiway improvements. The closure is scheduled to begin on March 30, 2026 and is expected to reopen on October 2, 2026.

During this time, the pattern of departing aircraft at SFO will change as shown, and some communities may experience a temporary increase in departing air traffic overhead.

More facts about the runway closures at SFO

- SFO's runways need to be repaved every 10-14 years based on activity levels.
- The current project will repave Runway 1 Right, which is typically used for takeoffs.
- The closure is being conducted to repave the surface layer, make improvements to adjacent taxiways, upgrade lighting, and paint new striping and markings.
- During this runway closure, SFO will operate all arrivals and departures on Runways 28 Left and 28 Right. This is a common configuration, often used during clear windy days, and is the configuration preferred by both pilots and air traffic controllers.
